

Wednesday Night Vespers - Faith, Fellowship, and Food!

Growing up in the Christ UCC congregation in Athens, I always looked forward to Lenten services Wednesday nights. Our worship time was 7:30, and so by then the day's work was finished, the sky was dark, and the whole sanctuary environment was different from Sunday mornings: the interior was a little darker, the order of service was abbreviated, the smells of coffee and sweets wafted from the church kitchen, and the whole ambiance was more relaxed. I found it was easier to get pulled into the narrative readings from the gospels, and to think about what we had just heard in the readings and sermon.

Continuing our theme of modern Christian biographies, in March we'll look at the lives of Pastor Henry Gerecke and the hymn writer Fanny Crosby. Pastor Gerecke served as a Lutheran chaplain during WWII, and at the close of the war was given a very challenging task: to serve as the Protestant chaplain to fifteen of the top Nazis on trial at Nuremberg. We'll look at his understanding of Holy Communion, the all-encompassing power of God's grace, and the power of confession. You're doubtless more familiar with Fanny Crosby, who wrote more than 8,000 hymns, some of which are regularly sung in our sanctuary. You might not have known that she was blind since early childhood. We'll look at her very personal faith in Jesus, and the ways in which her disability and unique way of interpreting the world contributed to her literary work.

On March 20 and 27, Pastor Phil will return and lead our Wednesday night services. Please join us for supper between 4:00 and 5:30, for good conversation and cheer between services. May this Lenten season be especially fruitful as we journey together as followers of Jesus.
