The Lenten Season Begins

I'm writing this letter on January 22, when tomorrow's forecasted high is -13 degrees Fahrenheit and its low is -23. It's hard to think of spring, of the hope for new life and vitality, when you're living in the dead of winter. And yet, there are already signs that winter won't last forever. It's no longer pitch dark by 5:00 p.m., and with every passing day in January, we'll get an extra three minutes of daylight. The days are slowly but surely growing longer.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18. The word "Lent" has its roots in the Old English word "lencten", from which we get words like "length" and "lengthen". As the days lengthen and grow during the Lenten season, so too are we called to lengthen and grow in the Spirit as we heed Jesus's call to repent of our sins and believe in the good news of God's grace and forgiveness.

At our Wednesday night services during Lent, we'll draw inspiration from previous generations of Christians who have contributed to the faith through their words and deeds. In the Wednesday night sermons, we'll take a closer look at the following six individuals whose faith helped them accomplish, endure, write, compose, and lead in the challenging times in which they lived:

February 25: **Martin Niemoller**, the Lutheran pastor who defied Hitler and endured seven years in Nazi concentration camps.

March 4: **William Tyndale**, a biblical scholar and Reformation leader who was martyred, whose English translation of the Bible set the foundation for the later King James Version.

March 11: **Julian of Norwich**, a 14th century English mystic, whose Revelations of Divine Love became a spiritual classic.

March 18: **Dorothy Day**, a radical journalist, author, and social activist whose work was rooted in her adopted Catholic faith.

March 25: **Abraham Lincoln**, the President whose unorthodox faith sustained him through personal tragedy while leading our country through the crucible of the Civil War.

April 1: **Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.**, America's foremost leader in the Civil Rights Movement, whose Christian faith formed his method of nonviolent protest.

Please join us this Lent as we deepen our faith from the stories and inspiration of Christians who came before us. Lenten services at St. Paul's are at 3:30 and 6:00, with a meal in the Guild Hall from 4:15-5:30. I hope to see you there! Christopher Ewan

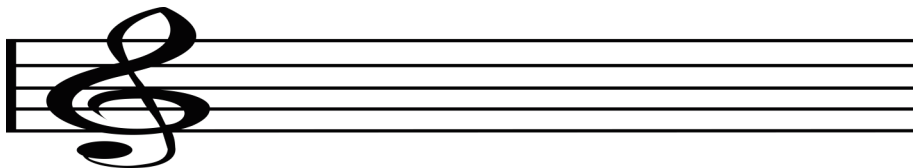

Rev. W. H. Ortwein began his tenure at St. Paul's as Assistant Pastor on February 1, 1942. In 1945, Rev. Ortwein became Senior Pastor and remained with the church until his retirement in 1978.

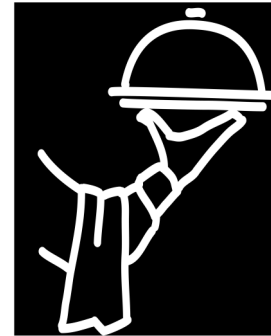
