At our Wednesday night services during Lent, we'll draw inspiration from previous generations of Christians who have contributed to our faith through their words and deeds. In the Wednesday night sermons, we'll take a closer look at the following six individuals whose faith helped them accomplish, endure, write, compose, and lead in the challenging times in which they lived:

**February 25: Martin Niemoller**, the Lutheran pastor who defied Hitler and endured seven years in Nazi concentration camps.

**March 4: William Tyndale**, a biblical scholar and Reformation leader who was martyred, whose English translation of the Bible set the foundation for the later King James Version.

**March 11: Julian of Norwich**, a 14th century English mystic, whose Revelations of Divine Love became a spiritual classic.

**March 18: Dorothy Day**, a radical journalist, author, and social activist whose work was rooted in her adopted Catholic faith.

**March 25: Abraham Lincoln**, the President whose unorthodox faith sustained him through personal tragedy while leading our country through the crucible of the Civil War.

**April 1: Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.**, America's foremost leader in the Civil Rights Movement, whose Christian faith formed his method of nonviolent protest.
