Advent and Christmas

I believe it was October 29 that I saw my first Christmas decoration of the season, a five-foot tree with white lights in the gift shop of Wausau hospital. Days later I heard Mariah Carey's "All I Want for Christmas Is You" on the radio, a song which by now we've probably heard a dozen times and by Christmas Day will have heard a hundred times more. After deer hunting is over and the Thanksgiving turkey is but a memory, the signs and sounds of the cultural Christmas season ratchets up through the whole month of December. But when the big day comes, the conversation quickly turns to New Year's resolutions, our plans for 2026, and the Christmas trees are out on the curb by January 1.

The Church takes a different approach to Christmas. Our Church year begins with Advent, a four-week season where we prepare our hearts and minds for Jesus's birth in Bethlehem. We'll read the prophet Isaiah's prophecies about the promised messiah to the Jewish people. We'll watch John baptize his followers with water and listen to his promise that a man would follow him who would baptize people with the Holy Spirit. We'll hear the story of an angel appearing to Joseph, convincing him to stick with his betrothed, Mary.



DECEMBER AT ST. PAUL'S THROUGH THE YEARS...

On **December 1, 1930**, Rev. Frederick Schaer, who served the church as pastor from 1888-1909, died at his home in Clatsop County, Oregon. Rev. Frederick Schaer's brother, Rev. C. Schaer, also served St. Paul's, from 1885-1888.

St. Paul's hosted a Community Hymn Sing on December 15, 1985.

The **Rev. Dale Wolfgram**, a Son of St. Paul's, celebrated the 40th anniversary of his ordination on **December 29, 1985**. Rev. Wolfgram was Pastor Ann Larrabee's grandfather; his portrait hangs in the hallway by the elevator.

In **1956**, at least 65,867 attended services at St. Paul's throughout the year. More than 1,000 people attended Sunday services each week!

What a difference a hundred years makes! In 1863, St. Paul's had only one wedding all year. In 1962, there were 24.
