## **Message from Christopher Ewan**

One of the men, when he saw he was healed of his skin disease, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him--and he was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" Then Jesus said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." - Luke 17:15-19

Our annual Thanksgiving Day was established back in 1863 by President Lincoln, amidst the most trying year of the U.S. Civil War. Though it is technically a secular holiday, the first unofficial Thanksgiving traces back to 1621, when a group of Puritan separatists at Plymouth Colony gave thanks to God for a successful growing season, and for having survived their first year in the New World. Nearly half the colonists who had landed in 1621 died of exposure, disease, and malnourishment that first year, and more would have died if not for the help of sympathetic Wampanoag neighbors.

As they feasted on the fruits of the labors (and the venison of the forest), the Plymouth colonists no doubt reflected on the trials of the past year, and the future hardships they would endure in the coming North Atlantic winter. They took heart that they had survived. They had learned a lot from their Wampanoag tutors. They had experienced the abiding presence of God through all their trials. And for having come through their first harrowing year in the New World, they gave thanks.

It seems nothing elicits a spirit of gratitude and thanks like enduring a trial or overcoming a hardship. Individuals who have had a near-death experience or survived a serious disease often report finding a new appreciation for the everyday pleasures and people in their lives. I often take good health (or at least feeling OK) for granted. But after I suffer through a bout of the flu, COVID, or even a scratchy throat, I'm made more aware of what a blessing it is to be able to breathe through my nose again, to not have a fever or chills, or to be able to swallow without pain.

The Samaritan man whom Jesus healed of his skin disease, came back to give thanks to God for essentially getting his life back. He would no longer have to live outside his village in a lepers' colony. His skin didn't itch, burn, or ooze anymore. He could be with his family and friends and worship God with them. He could go back to his old routine. He could plan for the future and go on living. But first, he made sure to return to the man sent by God, who made his healing and his future possible.
