#### **Search Committee Update**

Greetings from the Search Committee,

It has been quite some time since we have provided an update to the congregation. We have been working and meeting frequently throughout the summer.

As many of you have likely heard, we had a candidate that was intended to be presented to the congregation in early August. This was a candidate that the Search Committee was unanimously excited about as of our first meeting via Zoom. Unfortunately, as we were preparing contracts to be signed, it came to light that there were some financial gaps (due to inter-state economic differences) that we were not able to overcome. Sadly, that candidate withdrew from consideration.

Very shortly after that, we received a new profile that was also promising. We had 2 solid interviews with this new candidate and were making preparations for a 3rd, when that candidate removed himself from consideration citing "Personal Reasons".

While it is discouraging following the process so far down the road 2 times only to be disappointed near the finish line, it has been encouraging to receive all the profiles that we have had so far. Currently, we don't have any in-process applicants, but I'm confident that more candidates will continue to come in as we move forward. We will continue to sift through applicants as they are presented, but we might need to go a little outside of the box to make sure that we do what is best for the future of our church.

I'd like to thank everyone for their patience with this search. We knew it would be a complicated and potentially long process - - which has proven to be true. In the meantime, I'd like to remind (continued next page)

everyone that WE are the church and it's up to us as individuals and as a group to make sure that we're still serving our community spiritually and through our actions while we're continually moving forward though this challenging process.

#### And now a message from our Visitation Pastor, Christopher Ewan

You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before people, that they may see your good deeds and praise God in heaven. -Matthew 5:14-16

Our church has been around for a long time—since 1863. Until the arrival of the automobile, the church drew most of its members from the surrounding neighborhoods. If you wanted to come to church, you had to hoof it! But downtown Wausau evolved over time to accommodate autos and the social changes that came with reliable motorized transportation. Many houses were razed to make room for wider roads, parking lots, municipal buildings, and commercial spaces. Over the decades, the neighborhood around St. Paul's has changed, with fewer people living in the church's immediate vicinity.

For the first time in a **long** time, that is about to change! The Foundry on 3<sup>rd</sup> building project across the street from the church is just about complete, and by the end of this year the nearly 150 apartment units will be available to rent. By New Year's Day we'll likely have 150-500 new neighbors:




# Thank you!!!

On October 1, 1978, Rev. H.W. Ortwein was given the honorary title of Pastor Emeritus.

The cornerstone for the new sanctuary was laid on **Monday**, **October 3**, **1960**.

Mothers' Club (now the Ladies of St. Paul's) was formed **October 6, 1946.** 

Back in **October 1958**, there were 558 children participating in the Sunday school program at St. Paul's.

The Guild Hall was dedicated on **October 22, 1950.** The Rev. Gerhard Grauer, son of longtime St. Paul's Pastor E.C. Grauer and later a key architect of the formation of the United Church of Christ, spoke at the ceremony.
