

# Firedance<sup>™</sup> Dogwood

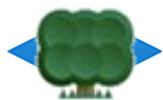
(*Cornus sericea* 'Bailadeline')

Firedance<sup>™</sup> Dogwood has an upright, rounded form with multiple stems arising from the base. During late spring to early summer, clusters of small, creamy-white flowers emerge, held above the foliage on flattened, umbrella-like clusters. While the flowers are not particularly showy, they add a delicate touch to the shrub and attract pollinators like bees and butterflies. Foliage will turn a burgundy red in the fall. The stems red color will intensify in the winter months.
