

STRONGER TOGETHER

The annual report you are holding was created within days of our 60-year anniversary celebration. We reflect on this year of service, while also reflecting on 60 of them. We are proud to hit another milestone of progress built on the founders who imagined Hope Haven over cups of coffee decades ago.

A strength that courses through each of those 60 years has been well on display this year as well: resilience. It takes resilience to make it 60 years. It takes resolve to navigate the changes in our field year in and year out. Both are needed in extra doses in the face of historic flooding.

In 2014, Hope Haven was impacted by a "100-year flood" in Rock Valley. Ten years later, on June 22, 2024, the floodwaters surpassed 2014's mark by five feet. The damage to our hometown was devastating. The same was true in Spencer, another community with a big Hope Haven presence. All told, 50 residents were displaced, and 48 staff members had major damage in their homes. Nine Hope Haven homes and four offices sustained damage. Several of those facilities will not be operational again.

We know from 2014 that flood recovery takes time. The scale is larger than 2014, but the process is similar: get people to safety, assess and repair buildings, work with FEMA and other recovery resources. We will make progress day by day for months into the future.

A small step of progress is reflected in the mission statement you see printed in this report. A change of wording says a lot about our philosophy of service. Our mission now says, "we partner with people." Nothing else changed. We still do it first as followers of Christ. We focus on work and life skills for the sake of productive lives and community.

However, we do these things in partnership. We are united as a Hope Haven board and staff, and work with external resources, but the most important partner is the one receiving services. Their voices are crucial. Indeed, the best examples of resilience at Hope Haven come from them.

SPIRITUAL RETREAT **PARTICIPANTS**

In FY24, Hope Haven's Spiritual Support team hosted nine Spiritual Retreat events for 20 youth and 271 adults in IA - Estherville, Sioux Center, Rock Valley, Spencer, Storm Lake, and Worthington, MN. They had two formal gatherings with five churches in Sioux Center, discovering ways to foster a more inclusive environment. In the coming year, a new collection of churches in Storm Lake will begin their journey of learning together.

PROGRAM & SERVICE IMPACT

MY DAY

We believe that people with a disability benefit from intentional thinking and planning on how to achieve a better life. Participation and inclusion in the community come from understanding what matters to the individual being supported, and from creating a strategy to make it happen. My Day programs continue to place a value on not just presence but membership in the community.

A highlight of the year was hosting a voter empowerment training with a representative from the Iowa DD council for our staff, 60 My Day members, and community members to learn their voting rights, why their voice matters, and how to cast their vote on election day. We invited elected county auditors to speak and learn about disability issues.

We strive to give voice and choice to all members. On Giving Tuesday, we raised enough money to purchase 10 communication devices for our members who are nonverbal or have difficulty communicating their needs. The devices have assisted individuals in expressing their hopes, dreams, and aspirations.

A new multipurpose building is being constructed in Orange City to accommodate the volunteer International Ministries workshop and the My Day services. Our members will have better access to the community, learn new life skills, and collaborate with the volunteers.

COMMUNITY LIVING

In Iowa and Minnesota, we offer a broad range of community living services and support to individuals with various of behavior disorders, disabilities, and mental illness.

To meet the increasing demand for community living, new handicap accessible homes were built in Sioux Center, Estherville, and Spencer, IA. Two new Residential-Based Supported Community Living homes opened in Storm Lake, IA to serve eight children. Hope Haven received a \$165,000 grant from the Sioux Rivers Region to proceed with a consulting group named Shiftability in order to facilitate new technology support that will alter our service delivery model. This will improve our residents' independence and enable them to live in a smart living model with value-added support.

Two employees have completed their certified training requirements to become instructors for the Sensory Processing Intervention, making them eligible to train other staff members.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Hope Haven supports people to gain and maintain competitive integrated employment, based on their unique interests, talents and abilities. We align our services with the Employment 1st philosophy, and we utilize an individualized and customized employment process. After many years of hard work and dedication, we were able to eliminate our 14c certificate. This means that we are no longer paying anyone subminimum wage.

Growth continues in our Iowa and Minnesota IPS programs. During this past year, we started a partnership with Western Mental Health in Minnesota. This has allowed us to now work with individuals in five different counties who we had not previously served. We continue to participate in the Iowa Blueprint for Change grant, which enables us to expand and improve the services we offer. We had two employees trained in customized employment principles, which will allow us to work with a wider variety of job candidates.

MENTAL HEALTH **SERVICES**

Intensive Psychiatric Rehabilitation (IPR) programs continued to operate in Le Mars and Sheldon throughout the year, and in May, we were able to start IPR services in Spirit Lake. Members in this program continue to receive a wide array of education and support in all domains of wellness as they work on their personal goals.

Our Peer Support program saw an increase in growth this year. Enrollment nearly doubled from the past fiscal year, and we hired several more Peer Support Specialists to meet the growing demand for the service. We are providing this service in nine counties in Northwest Iowa.

INTERNATIONAL **MINISTRIES**

The HHIM is working with amazing ministry partners around the world to supply mobility to support both physical and spiritual needs. Despite the flood in June, we will send wheelchairs to 5 continents in the coming year.

We are expanding our partnership to build Hope Haven Kid Chairs in Kenya for East Africa. We have upcoming trips to Ethiopia, Costa Rica, Kenya, Uganda, and Romania. A new multipurpose building is being constructed in Orange City to accommodate the volunteer workshop. Sioux Falls and Romania buildings are expected to be completed by the end of the year.
