Policy for Return of Title IV Funds (R2T4)

Purpose

This policy ensures that federal financial aid is earned in proportion to the amount of time a student remains enrolled. When a student officially or unofficially withdraws, the school must determine the amount of aid earned and return any unearned portion to the U.S. Department of Education.

a. When the R2T4 Policy Applies

This policy applies to all students who:

- Received Title IV funds (Pell Grant, Direct Loans, etc.),
- And officially or unofficially withdraw, dismissed, or stopped attending before completing more than 60% of the payment period or term.

b. Calculation of Earned Aid

The percentage of aid earned is calculated as:

% of term completed = (Number of days attended) ÷ (Total number of days in payment period)

- If the student completes more than 60%, they are considered to have earned 100% of their Title IV aid.
- If they complete 60% or less, the unearned portion must be returned.

c. Withdrawal Date Determination

- For official withdrawals: the date the student notifies the institution in writing.
- For unofficial withdrawals: the last date of attendance or academic activity as documented by instructors.
- For clock-hour programs: the last clock hour attended is used.

d. Return of Funds Order

The school returns unearned funds to the Department of Education in this order:

- Direct Unsubsidized Loans
- Direct Subsidized Loans
- Direct PLUS Loans
- Pell Grant

• Other Title IV Programs

e. School's Responsibility

Within 45 days of withdrawal, CTK must:

- Perform the R2T4 calculation,
- Return the unearned funds to the appropriate federal program,
- Notify the student of the outcome and any balance owed to the school.

f. Students' Responsibility

- If the R2T4 calculation results in a student loan overpayment, the student must repay it by the loan terms.
- If the student owes the school due to returned funds, they are notified and must repay the balance promptly.

g. Post-Withdrawal Disbursement

- If a student earned more aid than was disbursed before withdrawal, they may be eligible for a post-withdrawal disbursement (PWD).
- Loan PWDs require written confirmation from the student (or parent for PLUS loans) within 14 days.

h. Recordkeeping

• All R2T4 calculations, documentation, and notifications are retained for at least three years, as per 34 CFR § 668.24.
