

# SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

### **School Responsibilities**

- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Parents have access 24/7 to student grades of assignments and assessments. Report cards will be issued at the request of the parent.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. The staff is available by phone, voicemail, email, and text. Conferences may also be set up in a virtual setting.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities. Parents are encouraged to attend scheduled field trips.
