John H. Coleman Company: 80 Years of History



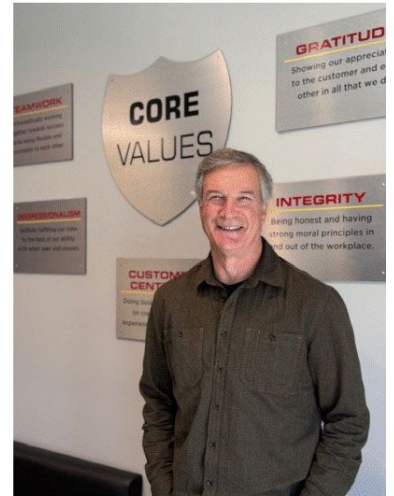
