His dedication and attention to detail are greatly appreciated and made the process smooth for everyone involved.

We are launching a new membership drive this fall to increase our visibility on Facebook, Instagram, and other social media platforms. This effort aims to attract new people to our congregation and boost digital traffic to our website. We look forward to new ministry opportunities through WHAM, Men's Fellowship, Women's Ministries, Youth Group, and Children's Ministries. 





### **Financial Corner**



2025 Member Plans-for-Giving (as of 6/30/25)

Budgeted Pledge Card Amount: \$163,000
Pro-Rata Pledge Card Amount: \$81,500
ACTUAL YTD Amount Collected: \$63,279
Fully paid up on Apportionments

I included the numbers from last year (as of 7/31/24) for comparison.

- 1) You can see our ACTUAL giving is up compared to last year. (\$72k vs \$68k)
- 2) Our Profit/Loss looks much worse this year. (\$-36k vs -\$9k) Keep in mind, our BIG expenditures
- 3) I could argue our Balance Sheet actually looks better than last year at this point. We have slightly less assets (\$158k vs \$160k).

But less "earmarked" funds (\$89k vs \$110k). So the difference is bigger right now than last year. The BIG negative-- our "Capital Improvement" line is currently negative (boiler room expense). Hopefully we can raise some funds to offset that.
