A season of Hope!

### Greetings everyone!

As we welcome another change of seasons, it feels as though autumn has quietly arrived. As we approach Advent and the Season of Hope, I am reminded that we have much to be thankful and grateful for. It is important to recognize that during these seasonal transitions, some of us face personal challenges. Many people experience seasonal disorders, which can lead to feelings of depression and melancholy during this time of year. Yet, even as the seasons change and life presents its difficulties, there is still hope, and God's presence is always with us. This Thanksgiving season brings significant changes in how many families will celebrate, as higher prices and massive layoffs will cause many people to seek help this year when they may not have needed it before.

This Christmas season may bring anxiety for some and a sense of dread for others. However, this is truly a season of hope. I trust that God's grace and mercy will be upon us all, and no matter what external cares we face, we serve a God who can give us peace during any storm. If you or someone you know is struggling, please reach out to our church community—we are here to support one another through prayer, conversation, and practical assistance. As we approach the birth of Jesus Christ, Mary's and Joseph's hope reminds us that this season offers joy, love, peace, and anticipation. Despite uncertainty, our faith assures us that God provides for us and remains present.

As a church community, it is important for us to strengthen the bonds of peace, unity, and fellowship during this season. Often, members see one another without forming deeper connections; however, this period presents an opportunity to foster new relationships and build a community founded on the love of Christ. Young individuals such as Mary and Joseph traveled to Bethlehem for the census, facing a period marked by uncertainty and anxiety. Mary, in her ninth month of pregnancy, undertook the journey alongside Joseph, who, as a first-time father, navigated the challenges and unknowns with faith that God would provide guidance and blessings, even amidst adversity. Despite finding no accommodation upon arrival and being unfamiliar with their surroundings, they continued to rely on divine provision.

Furthermore, when Mary and Joseph later fled into Egypt to escape Herod's persecution, they did so in pursuit of safety, understanding their position as refugees seeking asylum in a foreign land. Let us look with compassion to those who are doing the same, even in this perilous time. Where they are facing persecution from their home countries.

This narrative recalls my first cross-country trip taken shortly after finishing high school, moving from Philadelphia to Morristown, TN to pursue higher education. The experience involved saying goodbye to family and traveling by bus to an unfamiliar place, accompanied by concerns about fitting in, academic readiness, and adapting to an unfamiliar environment. Upon arrival in Morristown, it became clear that others were facing similar adjustments, with some using the experience to leave difficult circumstances at home, while others saw it as an opportunity for growth. A support network existed to help ease the transition despite the physical distance between cities. Challenges included financial constraints and occasional feelings of loneliness, but connections formed during this period helped address those difficulties. The journey into a unique environment prompted reflection on coping mechanisms and sources of support throughout periods of change. As the season progresses, it can be helpful to remember that support systems exist, regardless of distance or uncertainty, and can provide guidance and encouragement toward future goals.

The political, social, and economic landscape this season has called us all to reflect and change. For many families, they will need the support that the church has. And I know that we are up to the challenge. The Bible reminds us. God's Spirit is on me; he's chosen me to preach the Message of good news to the poor, Sent me to announce pardon to prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, To set the burdened and battered free, to announce, "This is God's time to shine!" Luke 4:18-19!

### NOTE from the Bishop



"Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves." -Matthew 10:16 (ESV)

Beloved in Christ.

I write you today to bring to your awareness some disturbing information that was shared with the cabinet. There are predators who have manipulated images of children that the predators obtained from video feeds of children sitting at the altar during children's messages. In those instances where we received specific reports of this activity all appropriate reporting and notifications were made.

It pains me that I have to request this, but I am asking that churches no longer broadcast video feeds of children during children's message. Please have the cameras focused solely on the person delivering the message or on members of the congregation. If you are broadcasting images of children participating in worship in other ways such as reading scripture, please make sure that you have documented permission from their guardians to broadcast those images. A written consent form or email from the guardians granting permission would be sufficient.

We will be looking for ways to incorporate this new learning into our Safe Sanctuary training. But because of the nature of this activity, I needed to inform you immediately, even though we do not yet have all the training in place we would want in order to assist you in complying with this mandate. If you have any questions about how to comply with this mandate, please contact your District Superintendent.

I cannot articulate my outrage at this development. With all of the work we have done as a denomination to protect our children when they are in our physical spaces, I am outraged that there are those who are abusing our children's images as we broadcast into cyberspace images of our children learning about God. Lord have mercy. Christ have mercy. God have mercy on us all.

Our children are a precious gift. It is a sacred responsibility to do all that we can to ensure their safety and prevent abuse of any kind. Thank you for your efforts in this regard.
