

Beat Michigan Bash - a BIG Win!

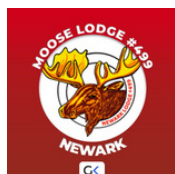

Lunch Buddies is Expanding South

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Licking & Perry Counties is excited to announce the launch of two new Lunch Buddy programs:

- Southern Local School District at Millcreek Elementary in Perry County
- Southwest Licking School District at Watkins Intermediate, launching in January 2026

BBBSLP's Perry County branch kicked off the 2025–26 academic year by introducing a new Lunch Buddy program at Millcreek Elementary. Program Coordinator Taylor Strohschein has already created 34 matches, pairing 34 Littles with 34 Bigs from Miller High School—making this the largest Lunch Buddy program within our agency to date. A heartfelt thank-you goes to Taylor and the Southern Local School District for their dedication and collaboration in ensuring students have access to meaningful mentoring relationships.

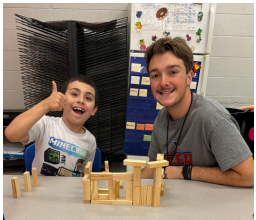
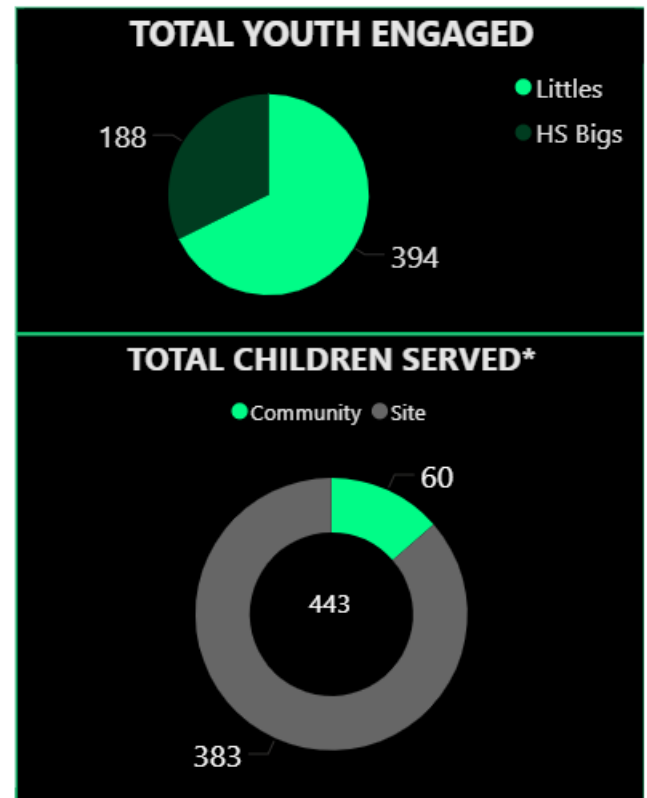
In addition, BBBSLP recently hired a Program Facilitator to launch and coordinate a new Lunch Buddy program in the Southwest Licking School District. She has already met with school administrators, and excitement is building across the school community—especially among the students!

At the end of November 2025, BBBSLP has served 443 youth: 383 Lunch Buddies and 60 Community Matches. We are also proud that 188 high school students (HS Bigs) have volunteered as mentors to our elementary school Littles.
