Confession and Forgiveness (Please rise in body or spirit.)

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Blessed be the holy Trinity, \pm one God, the wellspring of grace, our Easter and our joy.

Amen.

Silence is kept for reflection.

¹²[Peter] addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk?¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

¹⁷"And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out."

What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. ³And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. ⁷Little children, let no one deceive you. Gospel: Luke 24:36b-48

The holy gospel according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

^{36b}Jesus himself stood among [the disciples] and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴²They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³and he took it and ate in their presence.

⁴⁴Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things."

Meal God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ.




Offering Prayer (Please rise in body or spirit.)

Lord's Prayer


Please feel free to offer this prayer in whatever language or translation speaks most deeply to your heart.

Sending God blesses us and sends us in mission to the world.





Communion Wine Tasting Event: Frasinetti Winery has been sold and is closed indefinitely for extensive remodeling. This means we cannot, currently, purchase the Angelica we have used for communion for decades – and we are running out. So, on April 28, we will have a "Wine Tasting" after worship for those who take wine at Communion. If you have suggestions about what we might try, please email Pr. Holly. Keep in mind that Communion wine is usually higher in alcohol than table wine (our current wine is 18.5 %) so something in the Port/Sherry/Dessert Wine groupings would be appropriate.

Synod Assembly: This year's Assembly is June 7-9 in Fresno. Atonement needs to send two Lay Voting Members in addition to Pr. Holly. If you are interested in attending, please speak to a member of the Council. Registration is open so we need to sign up soon. Expenses are reimbursed by Atonement.
