



The Wonder Years Academy ILLNESS POLICY and The Management of Communicable Diseases

If a child exhibits any of the following symptoms, he/she should not attend school. If any of these symptoms occur during a school session, the child will be removed from the classroom, and the parent/guardian will be contacted to take the child home.

Elevated temperature of 101.5 (forehead) degrees Fahrenheit or higher

Sore Throat

Swollen Glands

Persistent Coughing

Persistent Sneezing

Excessive Discharge from Nose

Persistent Nausea

Episodes of Vomiting

Episodes of Diarrhea

Skin Rashes lasting more than 24 hours

Red and/or Swollen Eyes (with or without discharge)

If your child shows symptoms such as persistent cough or any discharge from eye or nose he/she should be kept home until the condition has been cleared up, or a physician's note has been received by our Director.

Children with a fever of 101.5 degrees Fahrenheit or higher MUST remain at home for a full 24 hours after the temperature has returned to normal. The child must be "fever-free" for 24 hours.

If a child should contract any of the following conditions, please report it to our staff IMMEDIATELY. The child may not return to the center without a note from a doctor stating that the child no longer presents a risk to him/herself or others.
