Cedar House Life Change Center receives \$30 million grant for expansion project





Cedar House Life Change Center, based in Bloomington, was recently awarded more than \$30 million by the California Department of Health Care Services.

With the \$30,057,960 grant, Cedar House will construct a two-story 32,000-square-foot building on its main campus in Bloomington to house 70 more residential beds, meeting rooms, visitation rooms, office space and more, according to a news release from Cedar House.

The grant to Cedar House is part of the \$3.3 billion in total awards delivered through the Department of Health Care Services' Bond Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program, Round 1, launch-ready grants, according to the news release.



Support from the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors and Department of Behavioral Health was instrumental in securing the grant, according to the news release.

“We want to express our gratitude to San Bernardino County and the Board of Supervisors, as well as state leadership for California’s dedication to the behavioral health needs of our community,” Jamie Lamb, Cedar House’s chief executive officer, said in the news release.

“This investment in Cedar House Life Change Center is a game-changer for Bloomington and the surrounding communities,” 5th District San Bernardino County Supervisor Joe Baca Jr. said in the news release.

“By adding 70 new residential beds and expanding access to substance use and mental health treatment, we are strengthening our behavioral health infrastructure and giving more individuals a real chance at recovery and regaining stability. We’re proud to support projects that bring meaningful, life-changing resources to our residents,” Baca said.

Cedar House Life Change Center provides treatment for people affected by addiction. Its Bloomington facility is at 18612 Santa Ana Ave.
