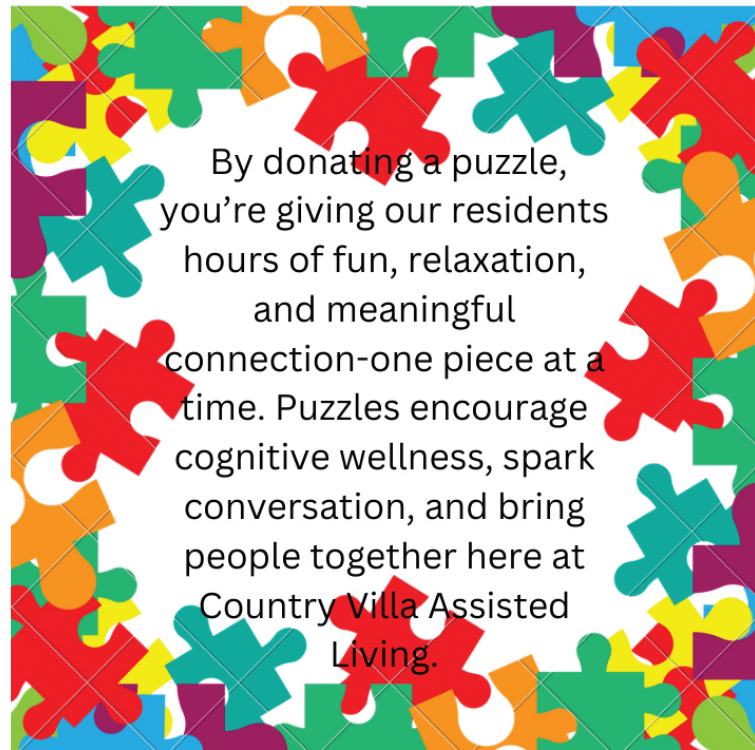
“Warm Meals for a Cozy Season”

Resident of the Month

Doris Ziesemer

Doris will be celebrating her 92nd birthday on January 2nd, the only current resident to have a birthday this month. Doris comes from a family of five: two sisters and two brothers. a brother and sister who live in Freedom.

Like many others, Doris grew up on a farm. After high school, she attended Outagamie County teachers college in Kaukauna and began teaching in a two room rural school. She continued her education at U.W Oshkosh and joined the Ashwaubenon School system where she remained for the next 36 years.

After obtaining a Masters Degree in education, she left the classroom and became the associate principal at Valley View Elementary school. At the time, Valley View was the largest elementary school in the state.

During the George Bush Senior administration, he initiated a program that gave schools the opportunity to be recognized as schools of excellence. Valley Views staff voted to apply and the principals completed the application. The application was approved and Valley Views principal, Doris, and a classroom teacher went to Washington D.C. to accept the award as a school of excellence. All the schools were invited to the White House South Lawn where President Bush addressed the large group. This was a highlight of Doris career in Education!

After Doris retired, she joined an organization called Learning in Retirement(LIR).classes, taught by volunteers, were held at U.W.G.B Here at Country Villa she is getting to know more people and participates in most all activities. Doris enjoys reading historical fiction in her free time.
