## **TREASURE**

"It is the glory of God to conceal a matter, but the glory of kings is to search out a matter." - Proverbs 25:2 NASB God's Word is filled with mysteries—buried treasures and riches...hidden patterns ready to be discovered...secrets prepared for us.
