A fast growing annual which may require staking in exposed areas. Long, weeping, wine-red trusses of flowers and seeds 18 inches long drapes towards the ground. The tassels may be dried and used in autumn arrangements. Young leaves may be sautéed like spinach and eaten. 3 to 5 feet tall.

## FALL IS FOR PLANTING TOO!

Gardeners living in temperate zones often feel that vegetables can only be planted during the “frost free” periods. With a little planning, many cool season vegetables can be seeded in the late summer and early fall. This “second season” is great for vegetables such as kale, lettuces, spinach, radicchio, beets and peas. Plant seeds for these crops in late summer and early fall as you begin to remove the spent warm season tomatoes, peppers and eggplants. You'll enjoy harvesting right through late fall and into winter. Add a little protection with Reemay's Floating Row Covers, and you could be enjoying fresh spinach from your garden right into the new year!

## THE “OTHER” FALL PLANTING

However, there is another type of “fall planting”, less familiar to today's gardeners, which can help get a jump-start on the following spring. Many hardy, cool season vegetables including lettuce, peas, spinach, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, carrots, radishes and cauliflower, when seeded during the winter, will germinate in the spring based on soil and air temperature, not the whim and fancy of the gardener. Lettuce, spinach and Chinese cabbage that are not planted early enough to take advantage of the cool spring will often bolt (form a seed stalk) when hot weather arrives. Radishes planted during the heat will typically bolt instead of developing an enlarged root. Planting in late fall just before the ground freezes allows these cold-hardy vegetables the opportunity to develop early when soil and air temperatures are ideal for this category of vegetable.

Certain other vegetables also take advantage of early spring germination and development. Tomato, squash, pumpkin and several other warm season crops frequently germinate early in the spring from fruit left in the garden from the previous fall. These “naturally” seeded vegetables harden off quickly in the spring and are remarkably capable of withstanding freezing temperatures. They often out-produce transplants set out after the last killing spring frost.

## HOW TO DO THIS?

In the fall, after the garden has been cleared of all dead plant material, till the garden area and mark rows the same as if you were going to seed in the spring. Just before the ground freezes (or after if necessary) seed the desired cold-hardy vegetables, cover with soil from the garden or potting soil (if the garden soil is frozen). Cover the seed as directed on the package. When the ground is frozen, adding a layer of straw, hay mulch or even shredded leaves (as long as they do not pack down) will help keep the ground frozen and maintain moisture through the winter. The goal is to keep the ground frozen to delay germination until spring and not to allow thawing and refreezing which will heave the soil and can kill the seed. A good inch of mulch is sufficient. Even small seedlings like carrots will come through 1 inch of mulch. The mulch will settle by spring; the inch that was applied will probably be about 1/2 inch thick. In areas where wind is a problem, mulch can be held in place with chicken wire or boughs from evergreen trees. Once the mulch is in place, soak the seeded area to provide sufficient moisture for germination.

## GMO and GE - What's the difference?

Every year we receive letters, emails and calls wanting to know if Hart's seeds are free of **GMO's**. We get these inquiries because people have heard that GMO's are unsafe, and they want to know that the food they grow from Hart's Seed is safe for their family. The use of the term GMO (**G**enetically **M**odified **O**rganism) has been used in the media interchangeably with GE or **G**enetically **E**ngineered organism; these are not the same.

**GMO** - **G**enetically **M**odified **O**rganism is a very broad term. In its most simplest terms, it refers to any living thing that has different DNA, no matter how slight, than its parent. This can happen in nature or in a laboratory. When you look in a mirror, you are looking at a genetically modified organism. The DNA of each of your parents has combined to make you who you are. You are not identical to either - you inherited some DNA from both. This also happens in the plant world, when insects or the weather moves the pollen from one plant to the flower of another plant of the same or similar species. The new seed from that plant “mating” produces a new plant different from either of the parent plants. This is a type of **hybrid\*** (and so are you). **Traditional Plant Breeding** is simply choosing the two parent plants that you would like to “mate” and playing the role of a bee moving the pollen of one to the flower of the other. By saving the seed from that union, the plant breeder hopes to have a new plant that will incorporate the best qualities of each of the parents. Some of our favorite vegetables and flowers are traditional hybrids that have been around for many decades such as Silver Queen Corn and the fragrant Bourbon Rose. These varieties and how they were bred are not the ones that have been the focus of the media.

**GE** - It's **G**enetically **E**ngineered seeds, crops, fish and hormones that have been the source of concern in recent years. These are created in a laboratory. In genetically engineered plants, the “mating” process is completely bypassed and often the DNA introduced is from a completely unrelated organism such as a bacterial pesticide or herbicide resistant protein (this is called a transgenic crop). These plants do not occur in nature. Because this new genetically engineered plant has different DNA than its parent plant, it is one type of a GMO.

In short, all crops have been genetically modified from their original wild state by domestication, selection and controlled breeding over long periods of time, but most GMO's are not genetically engineered. By the continued use of the term GMO, we doom ourselves and condemn our farmers unfairly.

The Charles C. Hart Seed Co. does not distribute ANY seed that has been produced through genetic engineering. Period.

That's our promise.

- Plant Seeds in Garden – Beets, Brussels Sprouts, Carrots, Leeks, Lettuce, Onion Sets, Peas, Spinach, Turnips

### APRIL: When soil temp is above 45-50 degrees

- Start Indoors – Basil, Cucumbers, Eggplant, Melons, Onions, Sweet Peppers, Spinach, Squash, Tomatoes
- Plant Seeds in Garden – Arugula, Beets, Dill, Endive, Kale, Lettuce, Parsnips, Edible Pod Peas, Radishes, Spinach, Swiss Chard
- Transplant to Garden – Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Celery, Chives, Leeks, Onions

### MAY: When soil temp is above 50 degrees and all danger of frost is past

- Plant Seeds in Garden – Snap Beans, Beets, Broccoli DeRapa, Carrots, Collards, Kale, Lettuce, Radishes, Spinach, Squash, Swiss Chard, Turnips
- Transplant to Garden – Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Cucumbers, Lettuce, Melons, Parsley, Spinach, Squash, Tomatoes
- Harvest – Beets, Lettuce, Radishes, Spinach, Turnips

### JUNE: When nighttime temp remains above 60 degrees

- Plant Seeds in Garden – Beans, Beets, Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Carrots, Cauliflower, Cucumbers, Corn, Kohl Rabi, Okra, Pumpkins, Squash, Swiss Chard, Turnips
- Transplant to Garden – Basil, Eggplant, Hot & Sweet Peppers, Tomatoes
- Harvest – Beans, Beets, Broccoli, Cabbage, Parsley, Peas, Spinach, Swiss Chard

### JULY:

- Plant Seeds in Garden – Beans, Beets, Chinese Cabbage, Collards, Corn, Cucumbers, Kale, Lettuce, Swiss Chard, Turnips
- Harvest – Beans, Beets, Broccoli, Corn, Cucumbers, Leeks, Lettuce, Onions, Squash

### AUGUST:

- Plant Seeds in Garden – Beans, Endive, Peas, Spinach, Swiss Chard
- Harvest – Beans, Beets, Corn, Eggplant, Melons, Onions, Peppers, Squash, Tomatoes

### SEPTEMBER:

- Plant Seeds in Garden – Lettuce, Radishes
- Harvest – Brussels Sprouts, Collards, Kale, Peppers, Pumpkins, Squash, Tomatoes

### OCTOBER & NOVEMBER:

- Harvest – Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Collards, Kale, Leeks, Lettuce, Parsnips, Radishes, Peas

## Buy Seeds - Not Plants

Sometimes growing from seed is not just an option — it's a necessity. The spectacle of a cilantro plant in a 4-inch pot with the same price tag as a similar sized pot of rosemary or sage is comical ... and not a little objectionable. Taprooted plants like cilantro respond to the stress of transplanting by immediately bolting. They can and should be sown directly into the garden soil. This herb is a member of a sizeable but (botanically speaking) mostly unrelated class of edible and ornamental plants that are most successful when planted from seed. This better-from-seed clan is a good one to get to know, especially in these times of shrinking budgets.

## Choose seeds over started plants - it's easy

The garden plant industry caters to the mass-market; seed catalogs, online seed companies and garden center seed racks offer a greater range of choices to the adventurous gardener. If you want your garden to stand out from the crowd, bypass the plant shelf and indulge in the abundant offerings of the seed rack. The list of vegetables and flowers that are actually easier to grow from seed is a long one. If a flower or herb readily self-sows, it is on the list. If a vegetable has an edible root, tasty leaves, or produces pods, it is likely on the list as well. Start with our 10 easiest plants to grow from seed and you'll quickly learn that a little pack of seeds yields a season of big satisfaction. Dare to experiment. Whether your aim is food, fashion, or fun, a seed-grown garden offers an unbeatable return on investment.

## Better-from-Seed Flowers

For a colorful landscape at a minimal expense, purchase a pack or two of each of the following, and sow them as soon as the weather is warm and settled in spring:

**Bachelor Button:** Full Sun. 1-3 ft. tall. Pink, Blue, White, and even near-Black

**Cleome:** Full Sun. 3-5 ft tall. Pink, White, Purple

**Cosmos:** Full Sun. 1-6 ft tall. Pink, White, Dark Rose, Red, Yellow, Orange

**Four O'Clock:** Full Sun to Part Shade. 2-4 ft. tall. Pink, Magenta, White, Yellow, Lime Green, variegated and broken colors

**Larkspur:** Full Sun. 2-5 ft tall. Pink, White, Purple, Blue

**Marigolds:** Full Sun. 8 in.-3 ft. tall. Yellow, Orange, Cream

**Sunflower:** Full Sun. Less than 2 ft. to more than 10 ft. Yellow, Gold, Cream, Orange, Red, Burgundy, Bicolor

And a few more: **Amaranth, Calendula, Morning Glory, Nasturtium, Nigella, Zinnia**

## Better-from-Seed Herbs

Direct-sown herbs yield many bunches of seasoning leaves, and the winter hardy herbs will come back the next year:

**Arugula** seeds should be sown in a wide row from spring through early summer, and again in fall. Each row can be cut multiple times for a spicy/nutty salad addition

**Chervil** is one of the few herbs that appreciates a little shade in summer. Sow fresh seed in moist but well-drained soil in early spring or late summer—the lacy leaves grow in abundance when the nights are cool. Chervil gives a delicate anise flavor to poultry, new potatoes, baby beans, or just about anything.

**Dill** is as striking as it is useful. Sow dill seed in full sun, keeping in mind that it tops out at about 3 feet. Plant anytime during the growing season; dill thrives in spring and early summer, and summer-sown seeds will often yield exuberant fall fronds.

**Summer Savory** is easy to grow yet rarely cultivated. Sow summer savory in full sun in late spring, keeping the soil evenly moist until the delicate seedlings can hold their own. By summer's end, the patch will provide you with more of the narrow thyme-like leaves than you can use. They are a flavorful addition to soups and stews, dips and marinades, vegetables, fish, and many other dishes. And a few more: **Basil, Borage, Chives, Cilantro, Garlic Chives, Oregano, Parsley, Thyme**

## Roots from Seed

Root crops are tasty, nutritious, and come in a wide variety of textures and flavors. Start with these for satisfying results:

**Beet:** Sow successive crops from spring through late summer. They will mature quickly to a harvestable size if seedlings are thinned to about an inch apart. Leaves are tasty too.

**Carrot:** The best thing about growing your own carrots is the satisfaction you can get from serving not just orange, but red, yellow, and purple roots. Sow successive crops and thin to about an inch apart. At the end of the season, pile straw on your carrot bed and harvest until the ground freezes.

**Radish:** Like carrots, radishes come in an array of colors. Plant the seeds about an inch apart as soon as the soil can be worked in spring, and you'll have fresh radishes in your salads in a month.

**Turnip:** If you've never grown turnips before, start with one of the Japanese salad types, a quick maturing crop that's best harvested small—from radish to ping-pong-ball size. The tops are every bit as tasty as the sweet roots. Sow seeds in both spring and fall.

And a few more: **Daikon, Kohlrabi, Parsnip**

## Easy Veggies from Seed

Seeds are the better option for most vegetables, if for no other reason than you get a lot more for your money! Remember to buy extra seeds for successive sowings.

**Lettuce:** Seeds can be sown thickly for baby greens, or thinned to 8-10 inches apart for heads. The colors and textures make a beautiful display in the garden or pot as in a salad bowl.

**Mizuna** and other mustard greens: Grow mustards as you would arugula; being family members they have similar needs. Cut small for salads, or large for healthful braising greens. Mizuna can be cut repeatedly. It lends a tangy flavor to salads.

**Spinach:** In many regions, spinach is more easily grown in fall than spring. With a blanket of mulch it has been known to winter over, even where winters are frigid. Sow seeds in rows and thin to 2-4 inches apart, eating the baby leaves. The dark green leaves are renowned for their rich iron and vitamin content—the fresher the leaves, the higher their nutritional value.

**AND MANY MORE** Vegetables that are EZ from Seed:

**Green Beans and Edamame Soybeans. Corn and Popcorn. Cucumbers. Swiss Chard.**

**Cabbage. Leeks. Mustards and other Leafy Greens. Pak Choi and other Asian Greens.**

**Melons and Watermelons. Peas, both Sugar and Snap Peas. Pumpkins and Winter Squash.**

**Zucchini and other Summer Squash. Kale. Collards. Broccoli Raab. Tomatillos.**

## Hybrid & Open-Pollinated - What's the difference?

Gardeners often come across the word “hybrid” to describe seeds in catalogs and on packets. If a seed isn't specifically described as hybrid, you can assume it's a non-hybrid, or more commonly called “open-pollinated” (abbreviated OP). Which type of seed is better for home gardeners? As is so often the case, the answer is, “It depends.”

### ♥ Defining Hybrid ♥

In the seed trade, the term “hybrid” describes seed that results from the controlled cross-breeding of two different but very specific varieties (“breeding lines”) of the same plant. The male pollen is transferred to the female pistil, pollination occurs, and a seed is formed. This seed is designated the F1 hybrid.

The benefits of hybrids are numerous. Plant breeders are able to carefully introduce traits such as improved disease resistance, earlier maturation, and better yield. The drawbacks? Hybrid seed tends to be a bit more expensive than non-hybrid. More importantly, hybrid seed doesn't “come true”. That means that if you plant a hybrid seed, let it grow and produce flowers and seeds, then plant those seeds, the resulting plants may not be identical to the parent plant. This next generation may have poorer quality yield for example, or produce flowers in a different color. The offspring will be the same species, but that's about all you can predict.

### ♥ Open-Pollinated Varieties ♥

Before the advent of hybridization, all plants were open-pollinated. The genetic composition of most open-pollinated plants is relatively stable – enough so that the offspring plants will most likely resemble the parents. There will be some variability among the plants, but not as much as with the offspring of hybrids. So one benefit of growing open-pollinated vs. hybrid is that you can save your own seed for replanting each year, knowing you'll get reasonably uniform results.


Some gardeners believe that open-pollinated varieties produce better tasting crops. Tomatoes are a good example, with people swearing by old favorites. The term “heirloom” refers to old-time favorites – usually varieties that have been around for at least 50 years. Most heirlooms are open-pollinated, but not all.

### ♥ Bottom Line ♥

So, what's best for your home garden? If you need to maximize production in a small space, or if you want all your crops to mature at the same time for easy canning and freezing, or if you've had repeated trouble with plant diseases, consider growing hybrids that boast the qualities you're looking for. If you're looking for great taste, look for varieties bred or chosen for home gardens (hybrid or open-pollinated), rather than those bred for commercial production, which often focuses on traits such as a long shelf life, sometimes at the expense of taste. And if you want to save seed from year to year, grow open-pollinated. Other than that, it's a matter of personal preference.


