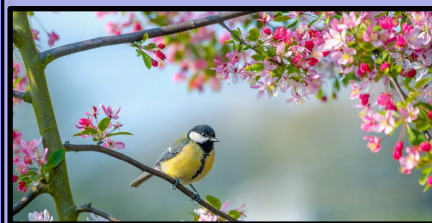
Art in March



We had so many great moments in March!



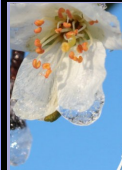
Spring is a Great Time to set up a Parent/Teacher Conference. See your teacher to schedule a time.

Have A Safe Easter

- **Egg Hunt Safety:** Designate a safe area for the Easter egg hunt, avoiding places near streets, electrical hazards, plants with thorns or bodies of water.
- **Supervision:** Always supervise children during activities, especially during egg hunts or when using craft materials like scissors or glue.
- **Food Safety:** If you're using real eggs, ensure they are properly cooked and kept refrigerated. Avoid using eggs that have been left out for more than two hours. Also use food grade dyes.
- **Allergy Awareness:** Be mindful of allergies when preparing Easter treats. Label homemade goodies and alert parents if using foods with potential allergens like nuts, dairy, or gluten.
- **Choking Hazards:** Be cautious with small toys and candy that may pose choking risks, especially for young children.
- **Hydration and Sun Protection:** If celebrating outdoors, keep hydrated and use sunscreen to protect against sunburn.
- **Emergency Preparedness:** Have a basic first aid kit on hand and ensure you know the location of the nearest medical facility in case of emergencies.
