Why I Give...



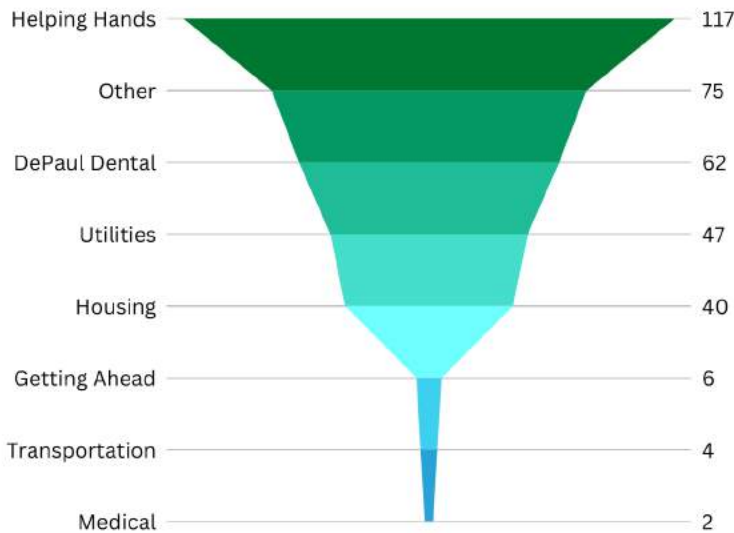
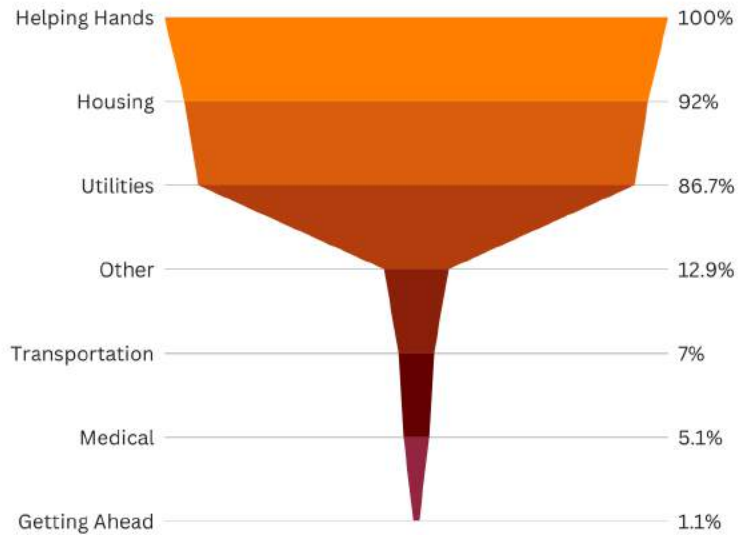

Seton Center operates a high-quality secondhand store staffed by paid employees and volunteers. We rely upon the generous donations of clean, sellable goods and continue to remain appreciative of the support of our community! **Revenue from the SFS covers many of the operational expenses of Seton Center. Any additional proceeds are used to help fund Outreach programs.** SFS also offers vouchers for in-store merchandise to families in need, hosts charity drives and collections for partner agencies, and donates unsold merchandise to other organizations for their use or resale.

In FY 2022, Seton Family Store partnered with the Frederick Rescue Mission, Advocates for Homeless Families, The Oranda Center, Mother Seton School, Frederick County Public Schools, The United Way, and Frederick County Public Libraries.
