## FENCES FOR DOGS

There are 2 ways to install a fence for a dog:

1) Tight to the ground.

This method requires the fence to be installed on the ground. There are very few instances in our area where the ground is perfectly flat and level with no dips. The result is the fence follows the natural flow of the ground which will result in the fence undulating with the dips, and it may look choppy. Appearance is not the primary goal of this installation, it's eliminating as many gaps under the fence as possible.

2) <u>Pleasing to the eye.</u>

This method keeps the tops of the fence straight as the fence flows with the general lay of the land and has no undulations or dips. The result is the fence looks great and may have gaps under the fence depending on the ground. Appearance is the primary goal of this installation.

The ground in your yard determines how many gaps are under the fence in each application. Tight to the ground may have few if any gaps. Pleasing to the eye may have lots of gaps or none if the ground is perfectly level like a parking lot.

In either case the goal is keeping the dog in the yard. Fesco Fence will add welded wire to the bottom of the fence where there are gaps to keep your dog in. We do this for **FREE** at the time of installation. No other company provides this level of security without additional charges!

Gates are also an area that needs attention with uneven ground. The slope of the ground determines how much of a gap is under the gate. This is because gates are level, the ground may not be. We recommend installing a threshold under the gate to eliminate the gap.

If your dog finds its way out of your fence after we've finished your job, or digs to get out then additional work to prevent that is not included in our free dog fence service.

If you don't like the look of welded wire closing the gaps under your fence provided by our free dog fence service, there are other options that can accomplish this depending on the type of fence you have:

Chain link can have bottom tension wire or bottom rail PVC fences can use pvc rails along the bottom

Aluminum fences can add puppy panel strips to the bottom

Wood fences can use rails or pressure treated 4x4 or 5x5's to the bottom

Your project manager can discuss these additional options and more as well as the costs for each option during the site visit.
