Our fun-filled and educational week-long camps are perfect for learning the basics of horseback riding, knowledge and horse care. We will explore how horses think, feel and perceive the world in fun, hands on activities. Campers will master the basics of grooming and saddling their horse under the guidance of our experienced and encouraging staff. Our air-conditioned classroom provides a comfortable learning environment as we cover topics like horse body language and behavior, safety around horses, parts of the horse, breeds, colors, horse tack, and more! Most importantly, we have safe and seasoned lesson horses who are well-cared for and love their jobs!

All campers are required to wear a helmet when in the barn and around the horses. We can provide them or you may bring your own. We highly recommend wearing long pants and closed toed shoes with a small heel and smooth sole. Whether it's your first time attending or you're a returning camper, each year brings new activities and adventures!

The first day of camp will be spent learning how to be safe and have fun around horses. When not on horseback, campers are taught barn safety and horse handling. In both the saddle and our air conditioned classroom, campers will be exposed to many facets of the horse world through hands-on activities as well as games. Daily topics may focus on anatomy, behavior, breeds, colors and gaits. Other topics will include horse equipment and English riding discipline.

On Fridays at 11am, we host a horse show for families and friends where campers proudly demonstrate the skills they've learned!
